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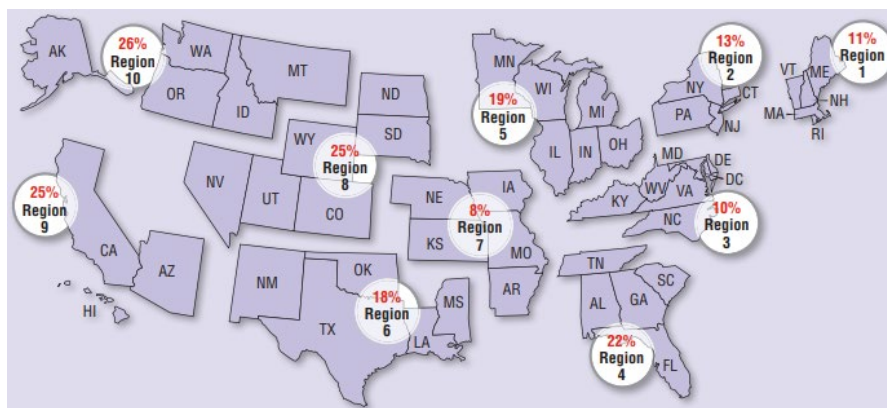

Inaction Could Be Fatal

A sobering [report from the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration](#) (NHTSA) was recently released regarding fatal crash rates around the country. As you have probably heard, fatal crashes are up since the pandemic began and preliminary statistics for 2021 show they continued to increase through the first half of 2021. The data suggests an increase of more than 3,000 fatal crashes in the first half of 2021 versus the same period in 2020. While your first thought may be: "Of course they are higher this year, we were stuck inside in 2020;" 2020 saw the highest overall fatalities in over a decade, despite lower traffic volumes. The first half of 2021 had a 13% increase in traffic over 2020, but an estimated 18.4% increase in fatalities. The values reported in 2021 are also the highest number of fatalities for that time period since 2006.

Fixing this trend requires more than just saying the same tired words: slow down, wear seat belts, drive sober, and avoid distractions. This is a trend that we as planners and designers need to take an active role to combat beginning with the initial plan through project design. Luckily, we aren't starting from scratch; FHWA has [28 different proven safety countermeasures](#) we can implement with our projects. Even better, most countermeasures are relatively simple and cost pennies to implement, especially when compared to the estimated economic impact of over \$1.5 million for just one drunk driving-related fatality.

Up to Speed

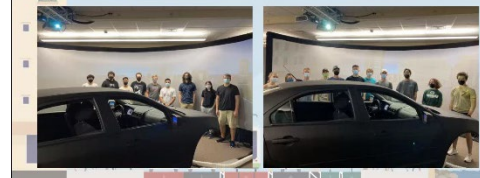

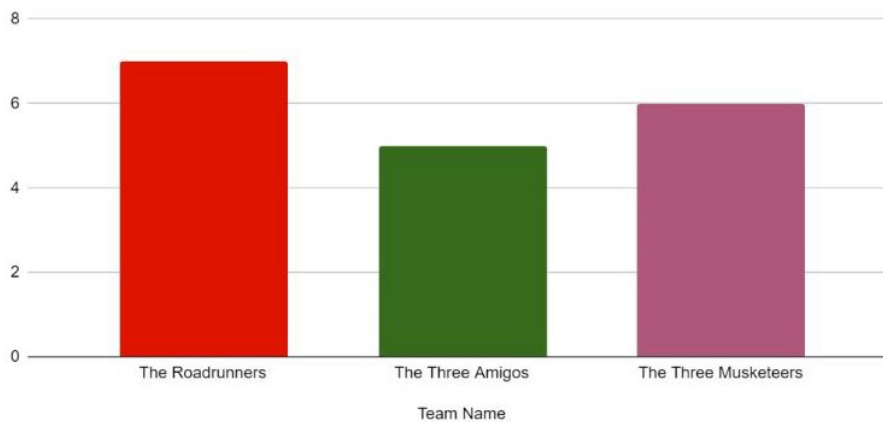
including free membership for all full-time students and planning for the transition from students to younger professionals. Starting in 2022, webinars will be free for members (PDH processing will still be fee-based).

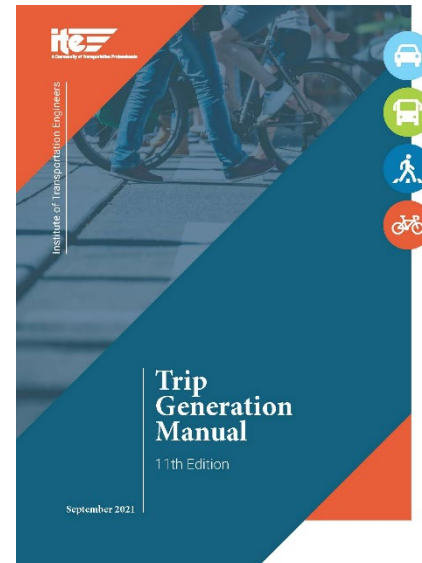

Upcoming Awards

Martin Bruening Award

Mr. Martin Bruening worked from 1924 until 1972 for the City of Milwaukee in Traffic Engineering. He was not only a leader in Milwaukee but was recognized as a national leader. During his illustrious career, he was an advocate and supporter of the three "E's" of traffic safety: Engineering, Education, and Enforcement, and his sound geometric design principles and early attention to good traffic signal design and operation were partly responsible for Milwaukee's consistent first place ranking in traffic safety for cities in its population class. Although Bruening believed in and was professionally involved in the planning and design of Milwaukee's freeway system to ensure the coordination and design for traffic operations on the local street system, he consistently warned of the necessity for a balanced transportation system. He authored several reports on the financially favored position of the automobile over mass transit and advocated a metropolitan transit authority and mass transit subsidy.

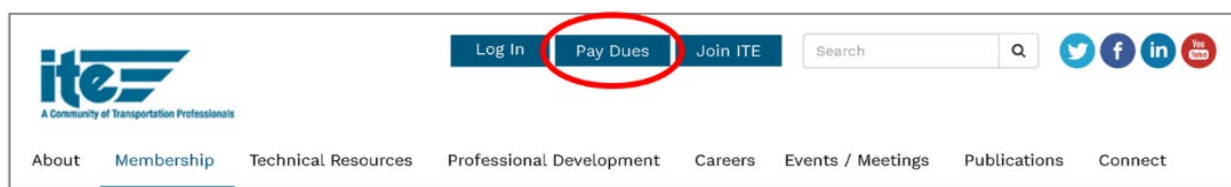
